However, the headlines really should be about the guests. Positive changes are being noticed in the guests demeanour after they've been using the shelter for a few weeks. We hope that this is an indication of them beginning to be able to move out of survival mode to some degree.

A fairly settled cohort of guests are using the shelter including two women; all of them are expressing their gratitude for this shelter provision. A couple of the guests are working and we continue to pray for move-on accommodation opportunities to open up for them all. The venues and volunteers have done really well to make the shelter a positive experience for the guests.

Many thanks to the five venues that have now finished their contribution. Five new venues open up from this weekend onwards (many of whom have not been involved previously). We are working on and pray for smooth transitions for all involved.


Volunteers:


