THE BRISTOL HOUSING FESTIVAL

Re-imagining better ways to live in our cities

We face a national crisis in the affordability of our housing and our public services. The option to simply ‘do more with less’ has become untenable and puts those in public service, as the stewards of the city, in an invidious position seeking to serve the public good but within a culture that is stretched.

As a city we need the courage to reimagine and to rethink.

Bristol is a city with an innovative and creative identity. It is a city that is prepared to stand up and lead. This leadership approach, by a city, will help create a narrative of what is possible and bring investment and jobs and long-term scalable solutions.

If Bristol as a city does not lead, someone else will.

Over the next five years the Bristol Housing Festival will:

- Promote, Showcase and Support the existing and new innovation and creative solutions that have been implemented across the city to address housing need – helping the city articulate its narrative, ambition and activity across the city; and
- Curate, Prototype, Test and Showcase new ways of creating homes, places and communities on sites across Bristol over five years using a mix of land (some temporarily available, or ‘meanwhile’ land, both public and privately owned) in the city.

The Festival will facilitate collaborative innovation that will deliver:

- New high quality and affordable housing models with a commitment to sustainability
- New investment and means of raising funds for housing
- New technology-enabled solutions to address housing need
- New models for place-making and social interaction that enable restorative and resilient communities – a commitment to wellbeing

The Festival will foster innovation in four main areas:

1. **Construction** – new types of Off-Site Manufactured and concept housing.
2. **Technology** – using these new communities as a test bed for various smart city technology and new technology application/platforms. A ‘Bristol Lab’ will incubate some of these new opportunities.

3. **Social Structures** – the Festival will showcase different types of community including co-housing, inter-generational and ‘mixed’ communities.
4. **City Governance** – The Festival intends to curate a city-wide canvass on which a city can work collaboratively on solutions and partner as an initiative of the One City Approach

THE LAUNCH EVENT

Overview

The Launch will be the first event of the five-year festival.

At Waterfront Square, we will host a number of concept houses, scale models, interactive activities, and showcase some of the initiatives, organisations and people already engaging with this vital issue. We will also communicate the ambition and commitment the City of Bristol has to take leadership role in creating change and enabling innovation nationally.

Over the two and a half weeks there will be various speakers, and exciting announcements about the future of the five-year festival.
