How to find the College

FROM THE SOUTH WEST

Exit the M5 at Junction 18 (Avonmouth) and take the A4 (Portway) toward the City Centre. Follow the signs to Bristol Zoo. Turn left up Bridge Valley Road at traffic light before the Suspension Bridge. Turn right on to Clifton Down and immediately left. Take the first right on to the Promenade

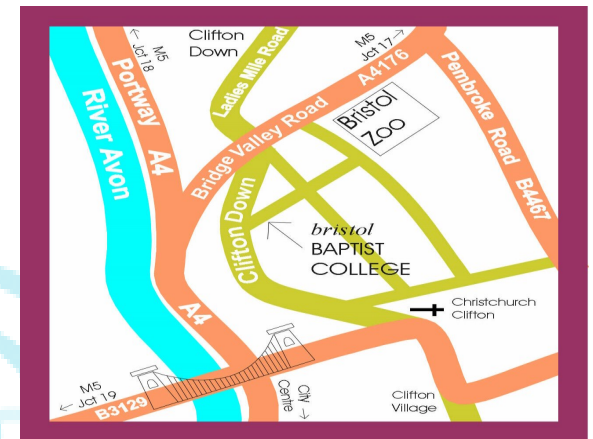
FROM THE NORTH AND WALES

Exit the M5 Junction 17 (Cribbs Causeway) and take the A4018 into Bristol, follow the signs to Bristol Zoo. Pass the Zoo on your left-hand side, take the second turning on your left and immediately turn left. Take the first right on to the Promenade.

BY PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Take No.8 bus from Bristol Temple Meads Railway Station or City Centre and ask for the 'Bridge Valley Road' stop. The return

bus is No. 9. You can also use a city train line (Avonmouth or Severn Beach direction), embark at Temple Meads Station and disembark at Clifton Down Station.
