7. Gift Aid

8. Churches Together England Subscription

Due to CTGB changing its address the subscription (£350) for 2015 was not paid. The trustees have agreed with CTE to pay these arrears at the rate of £70 per year commencing in 2018. The balance owed at 31st December 2018 is £280.

9. Employment Reserve

In 2017 it was necessary to renegotiate the contract for the Enabler for Mission and Unity. A reserve has been created to cover any possible future redundancy payments.

10. Bristol Networks

In 2018 the trustees agreed that funds generated from an appeal could be held to support the running of the Bristol Networks website pending the creation of a new website run by Christian Action Bristol.
