The Life Recovery team support people in recovery from drug and alcohol addiction and poor mental health. Over the last 30 years we have developed and run the Life Course to hundreds of individuals, giving life skills training in 4 key recovery areas: self-care, mind matters, healthy relationships and life admin. With some additional one-to-one support and facilitating volunteering opportunities our hope is to see everyone 'live well in their recovery'.

We are looking for a Deputy Manager to join the staff team with a particular focus of leading Life Course modules, alongside volunteers, and developing opportunities to expand our impact with female service users. We also plan to replicate the Life Course through promoting the materials to a wider market, offering to train and support other organisations to run the course themselves.

You will be working in a small dynamic creative team, reporting to the Life Recovery Manager and working alongside the existing Life Skills Deputy Manager and volunteers. You will have opportunity to use your life experience and passion for recovery as you develop in your knowledge and presentation of the Life Course, and in promoting the course to others. We believe in giving people the opportunity to discuss faith and spirituality as part of their recovery journey without any pressure to conform to one set of beliefs or values.
